An Act to amend "The Coroners Act, 1884."

[Assented to, October 23rd, 1889.]

BE it Enacted by the Governor of the Province of South Australia, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly of the said province, in this present Parliament assembled, as follows:

1. At any inquest upon any dead body the jury may consist of any number of jurors not being less than six, and it shall not be necessary, pursuant to "The Coroners Act, 1884," to require the attendance at any inquest or inquiry of any greater number of jurors than the number herein provided for.

Number of jurors at Coroner's inquests.

2. This Act may be cited as "The Coroners Act Amendment Act, 1889," and, save so far as inconsistent therewith, shall be incorporated and read as one with "The Coroners Act, 1884."

Incorporation and short title.
