An Act to amend the Cattle Compensation Act, 1939-1967.

[Assented to 5th December, 1968.]

BE IT ENACTED by the Governor of the State of South Australia, with the advice and consent of the Parliament thereof, as follows:

Short titles.

- 1. (1) This Act may be cited as the "Cattle Compensation Act Amendment Act, 1968".
- (2) The Cattle Compensation Act, 1939-1967, as amended by this Act, may be cited as the "Cattle Compensation Act, 1939-1968".
- (3) The Cattle Compensation Act, 1939-1967, is hereinafter referred to as "the principal Act".

Amendment of principal Act, s. 12—Statements to be made out on sale of cattle and stamps affixed.

2. Section 12 of the principal Act is amended by striking out from subsection (1) the passage "Every" and inserting in lieu thereof the passage "Subject to subsection (4) of section 13 of this Act, every".

Amendment of principal Act, s. 13—
Duty on sales of cattle.

- 3. Section 13 of the principal Act is amended—
  - (a) by striking out from subsection (1) the passage "There" and inserting in lieu thereof the passage "Subject to subsection (4) of this section, there";

and

(b) by inserting immediately after subsection (3) the following subsection:—

- (4) Notwithstanding anything in this Act—
  - (a) no cattle stamp duty shall be payable under this Act in respect of the sale of any carcass of cattle derived from cattle which were, within the period of fourteen days immediately preceding their slaughter, the subject of a sale in respect o which cattle stamp duty was paid or is payable under this Act;

and

(b) no statement or return pursuant to this Act in relation to the sale of any carcass referred to in paragraph (a) of this subsection need be made or lodged but the onus of proving that cattle stamp duty is not payable, pursuant to this section, shall lie upon the person otherwise liable to pay that duty.
