## No. 1542.

An Act to amend the Discharged Soldiers Settlement Acts, 1917 to 1920, and for other purposes.

[*Assented to, December 21st, 1922.*]

**B**E it Enacted by the Governor of the State of South Australia, with the advice and consent of the Parliament thereof, as follows:

1. (1) This Act may be cited alone as the "Discharged Soldiers Settlement Act Further Amendment Act, 1922." Short titles.

(2) The Discharged Soldiers Settlement Acts, 1917 to 1920, and this Act may be cited together as the "Discharged Soldiers Settlement Acts, 1917 to 1922."

2. This Act is incorporated with the other Acts mentioned in section 1 of this Act, and those Acts and this Act shall be read as one Act. Incorporation with other Acts.

3. (1) Notwithstanding anything contained in the Discharged Soldiers Settlement Acts, 1917 to 1920, the Assistant Minister of Repatriation may exercise and discharge any or all of the powers, duties, and functions of the Minister of Repatriation under the said Acts, whether in his personal or in his corporate capacity, and every act of the Assistant Minister of Repatriation under the authority of this section shall be deemed to be the act of the Minister of Repatriation. Assistant Minister of Repatriation may exercise powers of Minister of Repatriation.

(2) Nothing in this section shall in any way prevent, affect, or interfere with the exercise and discharge by the Minister of Repatriation of any of his powers, duties, or functions under the said Acts.
