An Act to amend the Holidays Act, 1910, as amended.

[Assented to 22nd November, 1973]

BE IT ENACTED by the Governor of the State of South Australia, with the advice and consent of the Parliament thereof, as follows:

Short titles.

1. (1) This Act may be cited as the "Holidays Act Amendment Act, 1973".

(2) The Holidays Act, 1910-1970, is hereinafter referred to as "the principal Act".

(3) The principal Act, as amended by this Act, may be cited as the "Holidays Act, 1910-1973".

2. Section 4 of the principal Act is amended by inserting after the present contents thereof (which are hereby designated subsection (1) thereof) the following subsection:—

(2) At any time before a special day referred to in subsection (1) of this section occurs, whether that special day was appointed pursuant to that subsection before, on or after the commencement of the Holidays Act Amendment Act, 1973, the Governor may by proclamation published in the *Gazette* revoke the proclamation appointing that day to be a public holiday or bank

holiday, and upon the publication of that first mentioned proclamation the day so appointed shall not be, and shall be deemed never to have been appointed as, a public holiday or bank holiday.
