An Act to amend the Highways Act, 1926-1970.

[Assented to 1st April, 1971]

BE IT ENACTED by the Governor of the State of South Australia, with the advice and consent of the Parliament thereof, as follows:

1. (1) This Act may be cited as the "Highways Act Amendment Act, 1971". Short titles.

(2) The Highways Act, 1926-1970, as amended by this Act, may be cited as the "Highways Act, 1926-1971".

(3) The Highways Act, 1926-1970, is hereinafter referred to as "the principal Act".

2. Section 31 of the principal Act is amended by inserting in subsection (2) after paragraph (h) the following paragraph:— Amendment of principal Act, s. 31—
Highways Fund.

(i) any amounts paid by way of fees or charges for the use of the ferry service to Kangaroo Island.

3. Section 32 of the principal Act is amended—

(a) by striking out from subsection (1) the word "and" immediately following paragraph (k); Amendment of principal Act, s. 32—
Application of Highways Fund.

and

(b) by inserting in paragraph (1) immediately after paragraph (l) the following paragraphs—

(m) in respect of the financial year that commenced on the first day of July, 1971, and in respect of each succeeding financial year, in paying to the Treasurer such amounts as may be appropriated by Parliament for the purposes of, or for purposes connected with, traffic and road safety services operated by the Police Department but not exceeding in the aggregate in respect of any financial year six per centum of the total of the amounts received by the Registrar of Motor Vehicles during that financial year by way of registration fees under the Motor Vehicles Act, 1959, as amended:

and

(n) in paying to the Treasurer such amounts as may be appropriated by Parliament for the purposes of, or for purposes connected with, the provision or operation of a ferry service to Kangaroo Island and works ancillary thereto.
