**HISTORY TRUST OF SOUTH AUSTRALIA (OLD PARLIAMENT
HOUSE) AMENDMENT ACT 2000**

No. 47 of 2000

[Assented to 13 July 2000]

An Act to amend the History Trust of South Australia Act 1981 and to make a related amendment to the Parliament (Joint Services) Act 1985.

The Parliament of South Australia enacts as follows:

Short title

1. (1) This Act may be cited as the *History Trust of South Australia (Old Parliament House) Amendment Act 2000*.

(2) The *History Trust of South Australia Act 1981* is referred to in this Act as "the principal Act".

Commencement

2. This Act will come into operation on a day to be fixed by proclamation.

Amendment of long title

3. The long title of the principal Act is amended by striking out "to repeal the Constitutional Museum Act 1978;".

Repeal of s. 3

4. Section 3 of the principal Act is repealed.

Amendment of s. 4—Interpretation

5. Section 4 of the principal Act is amended by striking out the definition of "the constitutional museum".

Repeal of s. 5

6. Section 5 of the principal Act is repealed.

Amendment of heading

7. The heading to Division 3 of Part 2 of the principal Act is amended by striking out "THE CONSTITUTIONAL MUSEUM AND OTHER".

Amendment of s. 15—Historic premises

8. Section 15 of the principal Act is amended—

(a) by striking out subsection (1);

(b) by striking out subsection (4).

Transitional provision

9. (1) The Governor may, by proclamation, vest any rights or liabilities of the History Trust of South Australia relating to the premises known as *Old Parliament House* (or relating to the land appurtenant to those premises) in—

(a) a Minister; or

(b) with the concurrence of the Joint Parliamentary Service Committee—the Joint Parliamentary Service Committee,

(and any such vesting will operate by force of this section and despite the provisions of any other law or instrument).

(2) A proclamation under subsection (1) may make other provisions that in the opinion of the Governor are necessary or expedient in connection with the vesting of rights or liabilities.

Amendment of the Parliament (Joint Services) Act 1985

10. The *Parliament (Joint Services) Act 1985* is amended by inserting in section 4 after its present contents (now to be designated as subsection (1)) the following subsection:

(2) A reference in this Act to Parliament House will be taken to include a reference to—

- (a) the premises known as *Old Parliament House*; and
- (b) any land appurtenant to Parliament House or Old Parliament House.
