An Act to enable the Lessees of Mineral Leases to surrender their Leases, and to obtain fresh Leases under the “Crown Lands Consolidation Act.”

[Assented to, November 17th, 1882.]

WHEREAS it is desirable to enable the lessees of leases granted for mineral purposes to surrender such leases, and to obtain fresh leases, under the provisions of Part v. of the “Crown Lands Consolidation Act,” of the lands comprised in the leases so surrendered—Be it therefore Enacted by the Governor of the Province of South Australia, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly of the said province, in this present Parliament assembled, as follows: Preamble.

1. It shall be lawful for the Governor, at any time within six calendar months from the passing of this Act, to accept a surrender, or surrenders, of the lands comprised in any lease granted for mineral purposes, and to grant a new lease, or new leases, of the lands so surrendered, or any of them, to the lessees surrendering the same. Governor may accept surrender of mineral leases.

2. Every lease granted under the authority of this Act shall be on the same terms and conditions, and similar in all respects to leases for mineral purposes granted under the authority of Part v. of the “Crown Lands Consolidation Act” and shall confer upon the And may grant new leases to present lessees.
