An Act to amend the Motor Vehicles Act 1959, and to make a related amendment to the Stamp Duties Act 1923.

[Assented to 28 November 1991]

The Parliament of South Australia enacts as follows:

Short title

- 1. (1) This Act may be cited as the Motor Vehicles (Historic Vehicles and Disabled Persons' Parking) Amendment Act 1991.
 - (2) The Motor Vehicles Act 1959 is referred to in this Act as "the principal Act".

Commencement

2. This Act will come into operation on a day to be fixed by proclamation.

Insertion of s. 39

3. The following section is inserted after section 38b of the principal Act:

Registration fees for historic motor vehicles

- 39. (1) If the Registrar is satisfied by such evidence as the Registrar requires that—
 - (a) a motor vehicle was manufactured before the prescribed date and has not been modified from its original design to any significant extent;
 - (b) the owner of the vehicle is a financial member of a club recognized under this section as a historic motor vehicle club;

and

- (c) the vehicle will not, during the period for which it is sought to be registered, be driven on a road—
 - (i) if the owner has ceased to be a financial member of a club recognized under this section as a historic motor vehicle club:

or

(ii) except—

(A) in events for vehicles of that kind held by that club (whether alone or jointly with another club or person) in accordance with a calendar approved by the Registrar;

or

(B) for other journeys subject to such conditions and limitations as are prescribed,

the prescribed registration fee for the vehicle must be reduced to the prescribed amount.

- (2) The Minister may by notice published in the Gazette—
 - (a) recognize a club as a historic motor vehicle club for the purposes of this section;
 - (b) if satisfied that there is good cause to do so, withdraw the recognition of a club as a historic motor vehicle club with effect from a date specified in the notice (being not less than 28 days from the date of publication of the notice).
- (3) Where a motor vehicle is registered for a reduced registration fee under this section-
 - (a) the period of registration must be 12 months and not a lesser period;
 - (b) no refund is payable by the Registrar on the cancellation of the vehicle's registration;

and

(c) the registration is not transferable.

Substitution of s. 98s

4. Section 98s of the principal Act is repealed and the following section is substituted:

Duration and renewal of permits

- 98s. (1) A disabled person's parking permit granted or renewed after the commencement of this section will, subject to this Part, remain in force for a period of five years from the date of its grant or renewal, or for such lesser number of years as the Registrar may, in a particular case, determine.
- (2) A permit may be renewed on application made in a manner and form determined by the Minister and accompanied by the prescribed fee.

Amendment of Stamp Duties Act 1923

- 5. The Stamp Duties Act 1923 is amended—
 - (a) by inserting in the second schedule after item 11 of the exemptions from payment of the Component payable in respect of Registration appearing under the heading commencing "Application to Register a Motor Vehicle" the following item:
 - 11a. Any application to register a motor vehicle in the name of a person entitled under section 39 of the Motor Vehicles Act 1959 to have that motor vehicle registered at a reduced registration fee.;

and

(b) by inserting in the second schedule after item 6 of the exemptions from payment of the Component payable in respect of a Policy of Insurance appearing under the heading commencing "Application to Register a Motor Vehicle" the following item:

6. Policy of insurance where the application for registration is made by a person entitled under section 39 of the *Motor Vehicles Act 1959* to have the motor vehicle in respect of which the application is made registered at a reduced registration fee.
