An Act to amend the Nurses Registration Act, 1920-1956.

[Assented to 23rd October, 1958.]

BE IT ENACTED by the Governor of the State of South Australia, with the advice and consent of the Parliament thereof, as follows:

- 1. (1) This Act may be cited as the "Nurses Registration short titles. Act Amendment Act, 1958".
- (2) The Nurses Registration Act, 1920-1956, as amended by this Act, may be cited as the "Nurses Registration Act, 1920-1958".
- (3) The Nurses Registration Act, 1920-1956, is hereinafter referred to as "the principal Act".
- 2. This Act is incorporated with the principal Act and that Incorporation Act and this Act shall be read as one Act.
- 3. The following section is enacted and inserted in the principal Act after section 10—

 Enactment of section 10a of principal Act.
 - 10a. (1) Members, other than full time employees of Members fees. the Government of South Australia shall be paid such fees as are from time to time fixed by the Governor.
 - (2) The fees of members shall be paid out of moneys voted by Parliament for that purpose.

Amendment of principal Act a. 214. Section 21 of the principal Act is amended by adding at the end thereof the following subsections:—

Provision for registration of persons trained outside the State.

- (3) Where a person who applies for registration as a nurse under the preceding provisions of this section is under twenty-one years of age but is otherwise entitled to be registered, the board may, notwithstanding paragraph (b) of section 22, provisionally register such person for the purpose of enabling him or her to undergo midwifery training in this State.
- (4) Any provisional registration granted to a person under subsection (3) of this section shall be valid for the purpose of enabling such person to complete the required midwifery training, but shall not otherwise entitle such person to practice as a registered nurse.
- (5) Any person registered provisionally under subsection (3) of this section may, on reaching twenty-one years of age, apply for registration as a nurse, mental nurse, or midwife.
