An Act to amend an Act No. 22 of 1866-7, to provide for the Leasing of the North Parade, at Port Adelaide.

[Assented to, 27th July, 1876.]

WHEREAS it is desirable to amend an Act No. 22 of 1866-7, to provide for the leasing of the North Parade, at Port Adelaide—Be it therefore Enacted by the Governor-in-Chief of the Province of South Australia, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly of the said Province, in this present Parliament assembled, as follows :

1. This Act may be cited for all purposes as “ The North Parade Act of 1876.” Short title.

2. The second clause of the said Act No. 22 of 1866-7 shall be and the same is hereby repealed from the passing hereof. Repeal of clause 2 of 22 of 1866-7.

3. The rents to be received under any lease granted in pursuance of the first clause of the said Act No. 22 of 1866-7 shall be paid to the Treasurer of the said Province. Rents under lease to be paid to Treasurer.

4. One-half of the said rents shall be paid by the Treasurer of the said Province to the Corporation of Port Adelaide. One-half rents to be paid to Corporation of Port Adelaide.

5. Such sum as last aforesaid shall be so paid during the month of January in every year, and shall be expended by the said Corporation in the construction and maintenance of roads, streets, and bridges, and drainage. Corporation to expend sum received in same manner as rates.

Balance to be expended in deepening and improving Port of Adelaide.

6. The balance of the said rents shall be carried by the said Treasurer to a separate account, and expended upon such works as may from time be necessary or expedient for the deepening and general improvement of the Port of Adelaide.
