An Act to amend the Police Offences Act, 1953-1960.

[Assented to 16th November, 1961.]

BE IT ENACTED by the Governor of the State of South Australia, with the advice and consent of the Parliament thereof, as follows :

1. (1) This Act may be cited as the "Police Offences Act Amendment Act (No. 2), 1961". Short titles.

(2) The Police Offences Act, 1953-1960, as amended by this Act, may be cited as the "Police Offences Act, 1953-1961".

(3) The Police Offences Act, 1953-1960, is hereinafter referred to as "the principal Act".

2. This Act is incorporated with the principal Act and that Act and this Act shall be read as one Act. Incorporation.

3. The following section is inserted in the principal Act after section 38 thereof— Enactment of principal Act s. 38a.

38a. (1) Any person who, in order to induce any other person to purchase or to agree to purchase books or other educational matter, states, holds out or represents, directly or indirectly, that he is a representative of or is in any way connected with, or has the approval of, the Minister of Education or the Education Department or any educational Sale of books and educational matter.

institution under the control of or connected with the Government of the State shall be guilty of an offence.

Penalty : One hundred pounds or imprisonment for not more than twelve months.

(2) If any person is induced to enter into any agreement to purchase books or other educational matter by any unreasonable persuasion on the part of any person acting or appearing to act on behalf of the seller or the seller's agent such agreement shall be deemed to have been induced by undue influence and shall be voidable at the option of such first mentioned person, if repudiated by notice in writing given to the seller within a period of twenty-eight days after the making of the agreement and any affirmation of, or agreement purporting to waive any right to avoid, such agreement to purchase shall, upon the giving of such notice, be void and of no effect.
