An Act to Reduce the Payments made to Members of Parliament by Five per centum for One Year, and to Reduce the Salaries of certain Officers of Parliament for a like period.

[Assented to, November 20th, 1930.]

BE it Enacted by the Governor of the State of South Australia, with the advice and consent of the Parliament thereof, as follows :

1. This Act may be cited as the "Parliamentary Salaries Act, 1930". Short title.
2. This Act is incorporated with the Payment of Members Acts, 1887 to 1926, and those Acts and this Act shall be read as one Act. Incorporation.
3. For the period of twelve calendar months commencing on the first day of the month after the month in which this Act is assented to every payment made to any Member of Parliament pursuant to the Payment of Members Acts, 1887 to 1926, shall be reduced by five per centum. Reduction of payments to Members of Parliament.
4. For the period aforesaid the annual salaries payable to the persons holding the offices mentioned in the Schedule hereto shall be at the rate set forth opposite to the names of the said offices in the third column of the said Schedule. Reduction of salaries of certain officers of Parliament.
5. No person shall be entitled to any damages or compensation whatever by reason of the reduction of his salary by this Act. No compensation for reduction.
6. This Act applies notwithstanding any provisions to the contrary contained in any Act passed before the commencement of this Act. Application of Act
