An Act to fix a Scale for the Payment of Jurors in Criminal Cases, and for other purposes.

[Assented to, October 14th, 1891.]

**B**E it Enacted by the Governor-in-Chief of the Province of South Australia, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly of the said province, in this present Parliament assembled, as follows, that is to say :

1. In lieu of the payments provided for by "The Jury Act Amendment Act, 1865," payments shall be made out of the General Revenue to jurymen attending criminal sittings according to the following scale:—

Scale of payment.

To each jurymen, for each day's attendance ... Eight Shillings

To each jurymen, for each mile in distance between the residence of such jurymen, as appearing on the jury-list, and the place where the sittings are held..... Sixpence

2. No person shall be summoned as a juror to attend any criminal sittings who shall reside more than ten miles from the place where such sittings are to be held.

Limit of radius within which jury may be summoned.

3. Jury lists, jurors' books, and jurors' rolls made since the passing of "The Jury Act Amendment Act, 1886," or hereafter to be made, shall remain in operation for a period of five years, or for such less period as the Governor may by Proclamation in the *Government Gazette* direct.
