An Act to apply, out of the General Revenue, the sum of Six Hundred Thousand Pounds to the Public Service of the Year ending the Thirtieth day of June, nineteen hundred and thirteen.

[Assented to, October 2nd, 1912.]

BE it Enacted by the Governor of the State of South Australia, with the advice and consent of the Parliament thereof, as follows:

1. Out of the General Revenue of South Australia there shall be issued and applied, from time to time, for the Public Service of the said State of the year ending the thirtieth day of June, nineteen hundred and thirteen, any sums of money not exceeding in the whole the sum of Six Hundred Thousand Pounds.

Issue and application of £600,000.

2. No payments for any establishment or service shall be made out of the said sum in excess of the rates voted for similar establishments or services on the Estimates for the year ended the thirtieth day of June, nineteen hundred and twelve, except so far as such rates are affected by the "Civil Service Act, 1874," or by departmental regulations.

Payments not to exceed last year's Estimates.

Exception.

In the name and on behalf of His Majesty, I hereby assent to this Bill.
