An Act to apply, out of the General Revenue, the sum of Four Hundred Thousand Pounds to the Service of the Three Months ending the Thirtieth day of September, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-five.

[Assented to, July 31st, 1895.]

BE it Enacted by the Governor of the Province of South Australia, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly of the said province, in this present Parliament assembled, as follows:

1. Out of the General Revenue of the said province there shall be issued and applied, from time to time, for the service of the three months ending the thirtieth day of September, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-five, any sums of money not exceeding in the whole the sum of Four Hundred Thousand Pounds.

Issue and application of £400,000.

2. No payments for any establishment or service shall be made out of the said sum in excess of the rates voted for similar establishments or services on the Estimates for the year ended the thirtieth day of June, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-five, as modified by "The Public Salaries Act, 1894," except so far as such rates are affected by the "Civil Service Act, 1874."

Payments not to exceed last year's Estimates.

In the name and on behalf of Her Majesty, I hereby assent to this Bill.
