**An Act to amend the South Australian Heritage Act, 1978.**

*[Assented to 15th March, 1979]*

BE IT ENACTED by the Governor of the State of South Australia, with the advice and consent of the Parliament thereof, as follows:

Short titles.

1. (1) This Act may be cited as the "South Australian Heritage Act Amendment Act (No. 2), 1979".

(2) The South Australian Heritage Act, 1978, is hereinafter referred to as "the principal Act".

(3) The principal Act, as amended by this Act, may be cited as the "South Australian Heritage Act, 1978-1979".

2. The following sections are enacted and inserted in the principal Act after section 19 thereof:—

Power of  
Corporation  
to borrow.

19a. (1) The Corporation may, with the consent of the Treasurer, borrow money from any person for the purpose of performing its functions under this Act.

(2) Any liability incurred with the consent of the Treasurer under subsection (1) of this section is hereby guaranteed by the Treasurer.

(3) Any liability incurred by the Treasurer under a guarantee arising by virtue of subsection (2) of this section shall be satisfied out of the General Revenue of the State which is hereby, to the necessary extent, appropriated accordingly.

Accounts and  
audit.

19b. (1) The Corporation shall cause proper accounts to be kept of its financial affairs.

(2) The Auditor-General may at any time, and shall at least once in each year, audit the accounts of the Corporation, and shall have and may exercise in respect of the moneys and accounts of the Corporation and the persons dealing therewith the powers that are vested in the Auditor-General by the Audit Act, 1925-1975, in respect of public accounts and accounting officers.
