An Act to amend the Parliamentary Salaries and Allowances Act, 1965-1974; the Constitution Act, 1934-1978; the Public Accounts Committee Act, 1972-1974, and the Public Works Standing Committee Act, 1927-1975; and to repeal the Statutes Amendment (Remuneration of Parliamentary Committees) Act, 1978.

BE IT ENACTED by the Governor of the State of South Australia, with the advice and consent of the Parliament thereof, as follows:

1. This Act may be cited as the "Statutes Amendment (Remuneration of Parliamentary Committees) Act (No. 2), 1978".

2. The Statutes Amendment (Remuneration of Parliamentary Committees) Act, 1978, is repealed.

AMENDMENT OF PARLIAMENTARY SALARIES AND ALLOWANCES ACT

4. (1) The Parliamentary Salaries and Allowances Act, 1965-1974, is, in this Part, referred to as "the principal Act". Short titles.

(2) The principal Act, as amended by this Act, may be cited as the "Parliamentary Salaries and Allowances Act, 1965-1978".

5. Section 5 of the principal Act is amended by striking out paragraph (c) of subsection (2). Amendment of principal Act, s. 5—  
General powers and functions of the Tribunal.

6. Section 9 of the principal Act is amended—

(a) by striking out from subsection (1) the passage "or of any recommendation";

(b) by striking out from subsection (1) the passage "or recommendation";

and

(c) by striking out from subsection (2) the passage "or recommendation". Amendment of principal Act, s. 9—  
Tribunal may prepare report on a determination and Treasurer shall cause such report to be laid before Parliament.

AMENDMENT OF CONSTITUTION ACT

7. (1) The Constitution Act, 1934-1978, is, in this Part, referred to as "the principal Act". Short titles.

(2) The principal Act, as amended by this Act, may be cited as the "Constitution Act, 1934-1978".

8. Section 45 of the principal Act is amended by striking out the passage "by this Act" and inserting in lieu thereof the passage "by or under this Act or any other Act". Amendment of principal Act, s. 45—  
Disqualification of members holding offices of profit.

9. Section 55 of the principal Act is amended by striking out subsection (3) and inserting in lieu thereof the following subsections:— Amendment of principal Act, s. 55—  
Standing Rules and Orders.

(3) Subject to subsection (3a) of this section, the Chairman of the Committee referred to in paragraph (g) of subsection (1) of this section shall receive for his services as Chairman a salary at the rate of two

thousand eight hundred dollars per year and each other member of the Committee shall receive for his services as a member a salary at the rate of two thousand dollars per year.

(3a) The salaries referred to in subsection (3) of this section shall increase or decrease in proportion to the increases or decreases in the basic salary of members of Parliament.

(3b) The salaries shall be in addition to any other sums payable to the Chairman and members in respect of their parliamentary duties.

## AMENDMENT OF PUBLIC ACCOUNTS COMMITTEE ACT

Short titles.

10. (1) The Public Accounts Committee Act, 1972-1974, is, in this Part, referred to as "the principal Act".

(2) The principal Act, as amended by this Act, may be cited as the "Public Accounts Committee Act, 1972-1978".

11. Section 8 of the principal Act is amended by striking out subsection (1) and inserting in lieu thereof the following subsections:—

(1) The salary of the Chairman of the Committee shall be at the rate of three thousand six hundred dollars per annum and the salary of each other member of the Committee shall be at the rate of two thousand five hundred dollars per annum.

(1a) The salaries referred to in subsection (1) of this section shall increase or decrease in proportion to the increases or decreases in the basic salary of members of Parliament.

AMENDMENT OF PUBLIC WORKS STANDING COMMITTEE ACT

12. (1) The Public Works Standing Committee Act, 1927-1975, is, in this Part, referred to as "the principal Act". Short titles.

(2) The principal Act, as amended by this Act, may be cited as the "Public Works Standing Committee Act, 1927-1978".

13. Section 11 of the principal Act is repealed and the following section is enacted and inserted in its place:— Repeal of s. 11 of principal Act and enactment of section in its place.

11. (1) Subject to subsection (2) of this section, the salary of the chairman shall be at the rate of three thousand six hundred dollars per annum and the salary of each other member of the committee shall be at the rate of two thousand five hundred dollars per annum. Salaries.

(2) The salaries referred to in subsection (1) of this section shall increase or decrease in proportion to the increases or decreases in the basic salary of members of Parliament.
