An Act to further amend the Supreme Court Procedure Amendment Act, No. 5 of 1853.

[Assented to, 24th December, 1858.]

WHEREAS it is desirable to amend the Supreme Court Procedure Amendment Act, No. 5 of 1853, by repealing clauses Nos. 182 and 183—Be it therefore Enacted by the Governor-in-Chief of the Province of South Australia, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly of the said Province in this present Parliament assembled, as follows:

1. Clauses Nos. 182 and 183 of the Supreme Court Procedure Amendment Act, No. 5 of 1853, are hereby repealed.

Clauses 182 and 183 of Act No. 5 of 1853, repealed.

2. This Act may be cited as the "Supreme Court Procedure further Amendment Act of 1858."

Short title of Act.

3. This Act shall take effect from the passing thereof.
