An Act to revise the Statute Law and for other purposes.

[Assented to 4th December, 1952.]

BE IT ENACTED by the Governor of the State of South Australia, with the advice and consent of the Parliament thereof, as follows:

- 1. This Act may be cited as the "Statute Law Revision short title. Act, 1952".
- 2. The Acts mentioned in the first schedule to this Act are Repeal of repealed.
- 3. The Acts mentioned in the second schedule to this Act Amendment of are amended in the manner shown in the said schedule.

Stamp Duties Act, 1923-1952	Section 109a (as enacted by section 3 of the Stamp Duties Act Amendment Act, 1942) is repealed. Second schedule— (a) Paragraph 22 (as inserted by section 4 of the Stamp Duties Act Amendment Act, 1942) is struck out. Section 55a—In subsection (2) (as enacted by section 3 of the Succession Duties Act Amendment Act, 1940) strike out "on which a proclamation is issued by the Commonwealth declaring that that war has ceased," and insert "declared by the Governor by proclamation to be the day on which that war shall be deemed to cease."
Evidence Act, 1929-1949	Section 66a (as enacted by section 3 of the Evidence Act Amendment Act, 1941)— (a) In line 2 of subsection (1) strike out "during any war in which the Commonwealth is engaged". (b) Strike out the whole of subsection (4).
Crown Lands Act, 1929-1944	Section 211a (as enacted by section 10 of the Crown Lands Act Amendment Act, 1940)—In the definition of the "end of the present war" in subsection (2) strike out "on which the Governor-General of the Commonwealth issues a proclamation that war no longer exists" and insert "declared by the Governor by proclamation to be the day on which the war shall be deemed to cease".

	be deemed to cease."
Pharmacy Act, 1935-1951 .	Section 22a (as enacted by section 3 of the Pharmacy Act Amendment Act, 1942) is repealed.
Emergency Powers Act, 1941	Section 2—In lines 4 and 5 of the definition of "the continuance of any war" in subsection (1) strike out "Governor-General has issued a proclamation declaring that the war has ceased", and insert "day declared by the Governor by proclamation to be the day on which the war shall be deemed to cease".
Shearers Accommodation Act Amendment Act, 1947	Section 2—In lines 7 and 8 of subsection (2) strike out "on which a proclamation is issued by the Governor-General declaring that the said war has ceased" and insert "declared by the Governor by proclamation to be the day on which the war shall be deemed to cease".
Wrongs Act, 1936-1951	Section 27a—At the end of subsection (2) add the words "and in a case where the claim arises out of the death of a person, a fault of the deceased shall be deemed to be a fault of the claimant". Subsection (5) is repealed.
