An Act to amend the Taxation Acts.

[Assented to, November 27th, 1895.]

DE it Enacted by the Governor of the Province of South Australia, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly of the said province, in this present Parliament assembled, as follows:

1. This Act may be cited as the "Taxation Acts Amendment Act, Short title and 1895," and shall be incorporated with the "Taxation Act, 1884," incorporation. and the Acts amending the same.

2. For the period of the financial year ending the thirtieth day Reduction of exempof June, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-six, section 2 of tion to One Hundred and Twenty-five the "Taxation Act Amendment Act, 1887," is hereby amended by Pounds. striking out the words "Two Hundred Pounds" in sub-division II. thereof, and by inserting the words "One Hundred and Twentyfive Pounds" in lieu thereof.

3. For the period of the financial year ending the thirtieth day Abolition of exempof June, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-six, if the taxable tion in case taxable amount of income amount of the income from all sources of a taxpayer in his sole exceeds Three individual right shall exceed Three Hundreds Pounds, he shall be Hundred Pounds. entitled to no deduction by way of exemption from income tax.
