An Act to amend the "Civil Service Amendment Act, 1881," and "The Civil Service Amendment Act of 1894."

[Assented to, December 9th, 1905.]

BE it Enacted by the Governor of the State of South Australia, with the advice and consent of the Parliament thereof, as follows:

1. This Act may be cited as "The Civil Service Further Amendment Act, 1905."

Short title.

2. Notwithstanding the provisions of section 3 of the "Civil Service Amendment Act, 1881," and "The Civil Service Amendment Act of 1894," the leave of absence which the Governor may grant pursuant to the said section and Act to any person in the Civil Service or in the employ of the South Australian Government shall, as regards every person entering or joining the said Civil Service or becoming an employé of the said Government after the passing of this Act, be limited to half the respective periods which the Governor might heretofore have granted.

Amendment of sec. 3 of Act 231, 1881.

3. Section 1 of "The Civil Service Amendment Act of 1894" is hereby amended by striking out the words "on the provisional and temporary list" in the fourth and fifth lines thereof.

Amendment of sec. 1 of Act 607, 1894.

4. The said Act shall be read and construed as if the said words had never been inserted therein.

Mode of construction thereof.
