## No. 893.

An Act to enable the Corporation of the Town of Port Pirie to Lease a certain Portion of the Land heretofore Dedicated as Park Lands.

[Assented to, December 9th, 1905.]

E it Enacted by the Governor of the State of South Australia, with the advice and consent of the Parliament thereof, as follows:

- 1. This Act may be cited as "The Port Pirie Drill Hall Site Short title. Act, 1905."
- 2. The Corporation of the Town of Port Pirie is hereby authorised, notwithstanding any other legislative enactment now in force in the said State, to let on lease to the Minister for Defence of the Commonwealth of Australia, for the purpose of its being used as a site for a drill hall, and upon the terms hereinafter set out, the piece of land mentioned and described and delineated by the plan in the Schedule hereto.
- 3. The lease of the said piece of land shall contain a condition Terms. that the said piece of land shall be used only for the purpose for which it is leased, subject to such terms, conditions, covenants, and provisos as may be mutually agreed upon.
- 4. The said lease shall be for a term of twenty-one years, and Renewal. may be renewed from time to time for any term not exceeding twenty-one years, in possession and not in reversion.

In the name and on behalf of His Majesty, I hereby assent to this Bill.

## THE SCHEDULE.

DESCRIPTION AND PLAN OF PROPOSED SITE FOR DRILL HALL, PORT PIRIE, SOUTH AUSTRALIA.

All that piece or parcel of land being that portion of the park lands at Port Pirie, in the hundred of Pirie, bounded as follows:—Commencing at a point being the production westerly of the northern side of Alexander Street for two hundred and twenty-four feet from the western side of Gertrude Street, thence northerly at right angles for two hundred feet, thence westerly at right angles for one hundred feet, thence southerly at right angles for two hundred feet, and thence easterly for one hundred feet to the point of commencement.
