An Act for granting to Her Majesty certain increased Duties of Customs.

[Assented to, December 17th, 1892.]

BE it Enacted by the Governor of the Province of South Australia, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly of the said province, in this present Parliament assembled, as follows:

1. There shall be raised, levied, collected, and paid to Her Increased duties. Majesty, upon the importation into the Province of South Australia of the animals and goods mentioned in the Schedule hereto, duties at the rate set forth in the said Schedule.

- 2. The Collector of Customs and all officers of Customs are Collector protected. hereby indemnified, protected, and held harmless against any action, claim, or damage to which he or they might otherwise have been liable by reason of any refusal to deliver any animals or goods imported into the said province on and after the twentyfifth day of August, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-two, or in bond on that day, without payment of the duties set forth in this Act and the Schedule hereto.
- 3. Every person who shall, on or before the commencement of Duty on articles this Act, have made or entered into any contract or agreement for commencement of the sale or delivery upon or at any time after the twenty-sixth day this Act. of August, one thousand eight hundred and ninety-two, of any of the animals or goods mentioned in this Act and in the Schedule thereto, shall be at liberty to add to the price contracted for so much

money as will be equivalent to the additional duty which shall by reason of the provisions of this Act have been paid or made payable on such animals or goods, and shall be entitled by virtue of this Act to be paid the same accordingly by the purchaser of such animals or goods, and to sue for and recover the same against such purchaser.

Part of Schedule of No. 405 of 1887 repealed. 4. So much of the Schedule to the said Tariff Revision Act, 1887, as relates to duties on "Horses, mares, geldings, colts, fillies, over the age of six months, except in saddle or harness; horned cattle—cows, oxen, heifers, bulls, steers, and calves, over six months old, except working bullocks in teams; sheep; pigs; meat, fresh;" is hereby repealed.

Act to be read in conjunction with No. 405 of 1887.

5. This Act shall be read and construed with, and as a further amendment of, "The Tariff Revision Act, 1887."

Limitation of Act.

6. The duties imposed by this Act shall not apply to animals introduced into the Northern Territory: Provided the same are not brought south of the twenty-sixth parallel of south latitude.

In the name and on behalf of Her Majesty, I hereby assent to this Bill.

Goods.	Quantity.	Rate of Duty.
Animals, living, viz.—Horses, mares, geldings, colts, fillies, over the age of six months	each	£2 (two pounds).
Horned cattle—Cows, oxen, heifers, bulls, steers, and calves, over six months old	each	£1 (one pound).
Sheep	each	1s. (one shilling).
Pigs	each	5s. (five shillings).
Meat, Fresh	per 100lbs.	5s. (five shillings).
