An Act to amend "The Volunteer Act, 1865-6."

[Assented to, 11th January, 1867.]

WHEREAS it is expedient to amend "The Volunteer Act, 1865-6," in manner hereinafter appearing—Be it therefore Enacted, by the Governor-in-Chief of the Province of South Australia, with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly of the said Province, in this present Parliament assembled, as follows:

Preamble.

1. This Act and the said "The Volunteer Act, 1865-6" shall be read together and construed as one Act.

Incorporation.

2. Notwithstanding anything in clause 8 of the said Act contained, any person who has served as a Volunteer for a period of three years under the Acts, or either of them by the said Act repealed, and who shall have obtained the certificate in such clause mentioned, shall be allowed to enrol himself as a member of the Reserve Force, although the period of three calendar months in the said clause mentioned may have expired at the date of his applying to be enrolled as aforesaid.

Volunteers who have served three years may be enrolled as members of Reserve Force, although three months from date of Proclamation disbanding force has elapsed.

3. Notwithstanding anything in the twenty-first section of the Volunteer Act 1865-6 contained, the rates of pay of the several officers, non-commissioned officers, and private men of the artillery arm of the Volunteer Force and Reserve Force, while employed in exercise or training, shall be according to the rates in the Schedule following: Provided that the Governor may, by any regulation to be made

made as prescribed by the said Act, reduce such rates with reference to members of the said artillery arm of the Volunteer Force or Reserve Force while undergoing recruit drill :

Together with an additional sum of Four Shillings for marching money for each day in which he shall be required to leave the district in which he is enrolled; and a further sum of Six Shillings for every such day to such members of the said artillery arm of the Volunteer Force or Reserve Force as may be required, or be entitled to keep a horse for his use as a member of such Volunteer Force or Reserve Force: Provided that for the purposes hereof not less than five hours shall be considered a day, and not less than two hours half a day: Provided also that nothing in this act shall authorize the payment of any sum of money except out of such sums as shall have been first appropriated by Parliament for the purposes of the said Volunteer Act, 1865-6.

Governor may
appoint Commission
to inquire into breach

4. The Governor may, from time to time, appoint any two or more persons, being Commissioned Officers of the said Volunteer Force or Reserve Force, to inquire into any alleged breach of duty or discipline on the part of any Commissioned Officer of the said Volunteer Force or Reserve Force; and the said Governor may adopt and act upon the recommendation of the persons so to be appointed as aforesaid, or may decline to act thereupon, as to the said Governor shall seem expedient: Provided that nothing herein shall affect any power or authority that is now vested in or may be exercised by the said Governor.

In the name and on behalf of the Queen, I hereby assent to this Act.
