An Act to further amend the Vermin Act, 1914.

[Assented to, December 21st, 1922.]

BE it Enacted by the Governor of the State of South Australia, with the advice and consent of the Parliament thereof, as follows:

- 1. (1) This Act may be cited alone as the "Vermin Act Further short titles. Amendment Act, 1922."
- (2) The Vermin Acts, 1914 to 1919, and this Act may be cited together as the "Vermin Acts, 1914 to 1922."
- (3) The Vermin Act, 1914, is hereinafter referred to as "the No. 1181 of 1914. principal Act."
- 2. This Act is incorporated with the other Acts mentioned in Incorporation with section 1 of this Act, and those Acts and this Act shall be read as other Acts. one Act.
- 3. The principal Act is amended by inserting after section 37 Amendment of thereof the following section:—
 - 37a. (1) Subject to subsection (2) hereof, for the purpose of the destruction of vermin it shall be lawful for the Commissioner, destruction of destruction of or any person authorised by the Commissioner, to lay poison vermin. or set traps on any Crown lands not within a District Council District or a Vermin-Fenced District.
 - (2) No poison shall be laid pursuant to the provisions of this section unless notice of such poison being laid is conspicuously exhibited on the land whereon the same is laid, and no poison shall be so laid within one hundred yards of any public road or way.

4. Subsection (2) of section 124 of the principal Act is amended by striking out the words "Five Shillings" in the first line thereof and substituting therefor the words "Seven Shillings and Six Pence".
