An Act to amend the Weights and Measures Act, 1934-1940.

[Assented to 23rd October, 1941.]

BE IT ENACTED by the Governor of the State of South Australia, with the advice and consent of the Parliament thereof, as follows:

Short titles.

1. (1) This Act may be cited as the "Weights and Measures Act Amendment Act, 1941".

(2) The Weights and Measures Act, 1934-1940, as amended by this Act, may be cited as the "Weights and Measures Act, 1934-1941".

(3) The Weights and Measures Act, 1934-1940, is hereinafter referred to as "the principal Act".

Amendment of principal Act, s. 30— Provision for weighing and measuring.

2. Section 30 of the principal Act is amended by inserting therein after subsection (1) thereof the following subsection :---

(1a) If any such person fails to have a weighing instrument, measuring instrument, or measure, or any necessary weights, in a place as required by subsection (1), he shall be guilty of an offence and liable to a penalty not exceeding five pounds.

Amendment of principal Act, g. 32---Sale by weight or measure.

^{of} **3.** Section 32 of the principal Act is amended by inserting after the word "sold" in the fifth line thereof the words "or delivered".

4. Section 65 of the principal Act is amended by striking Amendment of principal Act, out the words "within the meaning of this Act" occurring in the third and the sixth lines thereof.
