An Act to amend the Workmen's Compensation Acts, 1911 to 1925.

[Assented to, November 25th, 1926.]

BE it Enacted by the Governor of the State of South Australia, with the advice and consent of the Parliament thereof, as follows :

1. (1) This Act may be cited as the "Workmen's Compensation Act Amendment Act, 1926". Short titles

(2) The Workmen's Compensation Acts, 1911 to 1925, and this Act may be cited together as the "Workmen's Compensation Acts, 1911 to 1926".

(3) The Workmen's Compensation Act, 1911, is hereinafter referred to as "the principal Act." No. 1053 of 1911.

2. The proviso to subparagraph (b) of paragraph (1) of the First Schedule to the principal Act (which said proviso was enacted by paragraph (a) of section 4 of the Workmen's Compensation Act Amendment Act, 1925) is amended so as to read as follows :— Amendment of principal Act, First Schedule—
Minimum amount of compensation.

Provided that, subject to subdivision (II.) of subparagraph (b) of this paragraph, no workman who is a married man or a widower and who has one or more children under the age of fourteen years totally or mainly dependent upon his earnings, shall receive during total incapacity a less sum per week than Two Pounds plus Seven Shillings and Sixpence per week for every such child, and no workman who is a married man not having

having any such child totally or mainly dependent on his earnings shall receive during total incapacity a less sum per week than Two Pounds, and no workman who is a single man or who is a widower not having any such child totally or mainly dependent on his earnings, shall receive during total incapacity a less sum per week than Thirty Shillings.

In the name and on behalf of His Majesty, I hereby assent to this Bill.
