## GEORGII V REGIS. A.D. 1926.

## No. 1746.

An Act to amend the Workmen's Compensation Acts, 1911 to 1925.

[Assented to, November 25th, 1926]

BE it Enacted by the Governor of the State of South Australia, with the advice and consent of the Parliament thereof, as follows:

- 1. (1) This Act may be cited as the "Workmen's Compensation Short titles Act Amendment Act, 1926".
- (2) The Workmen's Compensation Acts, 1911 to 1925, and this Act may be cited together as the "Workmen's Compensation Acts, 1911 to 1926".
- (3) The Workmen's Compensation Act, 1911, is hereinafter referred No. 1053 of 1911. to as "the principal Act."
- 2. The proviso to subparagraph (b) of paragraph (1) of the First Amendment of Schedule to the principal Act (which said proviso was enacted by Schedule paragraph (a) of section 4 of the Workmen's Compensation Act Minimum amount of Amendment Act, 1925) is amended so as to read as follows:—

Provided that, subject to subdivision (II.) of subparagraph (b) of this paragraph, no workman who is a married man or a widower and who has one or more children under the age of fourteen years totally or mainly dependent upon his earnings, shall receive during total incapacity a less sum per week than Two Pounds plus Seven Shillings and Sixpence per week for every such child, and no workman who is a married man not having Workmen's Compensation Act Amendment Act.—1926.

having any such child totally or mainly dependent on his earnings shall receive during total incapacity a less sum per week than Two Pounds, and no workman who is a single man or who is a widower not having any such child totally or mainly dependent on his earnings, shall receive during total incapacity a less sum per week than Thirty Shillings.

In the name and on behalf of His Majesty, I hereby assent to this Bill.
