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## No. 1714.

An Act to further amend the Width of Tires Act, 1923.

[Assented to, January 6th, 1926.]

**B**E it Enacted by the Governor of the State of South Australia, with the advice and consent of the Parliament thereof, as follows:—

1. (1) This Act may be cited as the “Width of Tires Act Short titles. Amendment Act, 1925.”

(2) The Width of Tires Acts, 1923 and 1924, and this Act may be cited together as the “Width of Tires Acts, 1923 to 1925.”

(3) The Width of Tires Act, 1923, is hereinafter referred to as “the No. 1580 of 1923. principal Act.”

2. Section 7 of the principal Act is amended by striking out the words “not within a local government area” in the third line of subsection (2) thereof. Amendment of principal Act, s. 7—  
Authorised officers.

3. Section 16 of the principal Act is amended— Amendment of *ibid.*,  
s. 16—

(a) by striking out the words “at the request of any Council” in the first line thereof; Alteration of  
minimum loads by  
regulation.

(b) by striking out the words “only to the area of such Council” in the second line thereof, and by substituting therefor the words “to the road or portion of the State specified in the regulations”; and

(c) by

(c) by adding the following proviso at the end of subsection (1) thereof:—

Provided that no such regulations shall be made until one month after the proposed regulations have been forwarded by the Minister to the Council in the area of which the said road or portion of the State is situated and any suggestions of the Council in relation thereto (if any) have been considered by the Minister.

4. Section 20 of the principal Act is amended so as to read as follows:—

Appropriation of  
penalties

20. All money collected as fines in respect of convictions under this Act shall be paid into General Revenue: Provided that where any fine is imposed in respect of an offence committed within a local government area and the complaint in respect of the offence was made by an officer of the Council of such area, one moiety of such fine shall be paid to the Council for the use and benefit of the area.
