An Act to provide that a certain area of Park Lands shall be included in the Cemetery at West Terrace, Adelaide, and shall form part of the Soldiers' Section of that Cemetery.

[Assented to 9th November, 1944.]

BE IT ENACTED by the Governor of the State of South Australia, with the advice and consent of the Parliament, as follows :

1. This Act may be cited as the "West Terrace Cemetery (Soldiers' Section) Extension Act, 1944". Short title.

2. Section 551 of the Hundred of Adelaide shall, as from the passing of this Act— Extension of soldiers' section of West Terrace Cemetery.

- (a) cease to be park lands :
- (b) be included in the West Terrace Cemetery :
- (c) form part of that section of the West Terrace Cemetery which is used for the burial of ex-members of the Australian Imperial Forces of the 1914-1918 War :
- (d) subject to paragraph (e) of this section, be under the control of the Commissioner of Public Works :
- (e) be managed and maintained in accordance with arrangements made between the Commissioner of Public Works and the body known as the A.I.F. Cemetery Trust Incorporated.

In the name and on behalf of His Majesty, I hereby assent to this Bill.
