## AUCTION.

No. 28 of 1949.

AN ACT to amend the *Auction Act* 1913.

[5 October, 1949.]

**B**E it enacted by His Excellency the Governor of Tasmania, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows:—

**1**—(1) This Act may be cited as the *Auction Act* 1949.

(2) The *Auction Act*, 1913\*, as subsequently amended, is in this Act referred to as the Principal Act.

**2** Section twelve of the Principal Act is amended by omitting the word “and”, after paragraph I., and by inserting after that paragraph the following paragraph:—

“IA. Any auction sale of wool may take place between the hours of six o'clock in the morning and half-past ten o'clock in the evening of the same day: and”.
