# SUPREME COURT (No. 2).

# No. 45 of 1958.

AN ACT to amend the Supreme Court Act 1831.

[21 November 1958.]

BE it enacted by His Excellency the Governor of Tasmania, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows:—

1—(1) This Act may be cited as the Supreme Court Act Short title (No. 2) 1958.
