APPROPRIATION.

No. 44 of 1958.

AN ACT to grant and apply out of the Consolidated Revenue a sum for the service of the year ending on the thirtieth day of June 1959, and to appropriate the supplies granted by Parliament for that year. [31 October 1958.]

BE it enacted by His Excellency the Governor of Tasmania, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows:—

Short title.

1 This Act may be cited as the *Appropriation Act 1958-1959*.

2 The Treasurer may issue out of the Consolidated Revenue, and apply towards making good the supply hereby granted to Her Majesty for the service of the year ending on the thirtieth day of June 1959, the sum of £8,556,886. Issue and application of £8,556,886.

3 The sums granted by this Act and by the *Supply Act* 1958-1959 out of the Consolidated Revenue towards making good the supply granted to Her Majesty for the service of the year ending on the thirtieth day of June 1959, amounting as appears by the first schedule to the sum of £12,587,716, are appropriated and shall be deemed to have been appropriated, as from the first day of July 1958, for the purposes and services expressed in the second schedule in relation to the financial year ending on the thirtieth day of June 1959. Appropriation of supplies.
