## No. 27 of 1965.

# AN ACT to amend the Traffic Act 1925.

[12 October 1965.]

BE it enacted by His Excellency the Governor of Tasmania, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows:—

Short title and citation.

- 1—(1) This Act may be cited as the Traffic Act 1965.
- (2) The Traffic Act 1925, as subsequently amended, is in this Act referred to as the Principal Act.

The second schedule.

- 2 The second schedule to the Principal Act is amended by omitting therefrom the items—
- "Issue of a licence 1 10 0
  "Renewal of licence 1 0 0",
  occurring under the heading "Driver of motor vehicle—" and substituting therefor the following items:—
  - "Issue of a licence 2 0 0 "Renewal of a licence 1 10 0"

Operation of amendment.

3 The fee payable in respect of the issue or renewal of a driver's licence by virtue of the second schedule to the Principal Act (as amended by section two of this Act) is payable in respect of every licence (whenever issued or renewed) that, by virtue of that Act and the regulations, will expire on the fifteenth day of January 1967 or any later day.

AN ACT to grant and apply out of the Consolidated Revenue a sum for the service of the year ending on the thirtieth day of June 1966, and to appropriate the supplies granted by Parliament for that year. [14 October 1965.]

BE it enacted by His Excellency the Governor of Tasmania, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows:—

Short title.

1 This Act may be cited as the Appropriation Act 1965-1966.

- 2 The Treasurer may issue out of the Consolidated application of Revenue, and apply towards making good the supply hereby £16,828,021. granted to Her Majesty for the service of the year ending on the thirtieth day of June 1966 the sum of £16,328,021.
- 3 The sums granted by this Act and by the Supply Act Appropriation of 1965-1966 out of the Consolidated Revenue towards making supplies. good the supply granted to Her Majesty for the service of the year ending on the thirtieth day of June 1966, amounting as appears by the first schedule to the sum of £24,254,121, are appropriated and shall be deemed to have been appropriated, as from the first day of July 1965, for the purposes and services expressed in the second schedule in relation to the financial year ending on the thirtieth day of June 1966.
