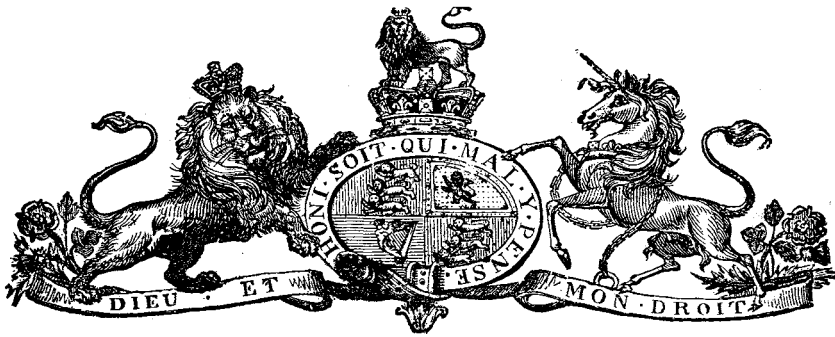

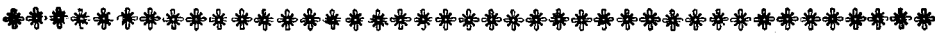

AN ACT Supplementary to the Acts for A.D. 1897.  
appropriating certain Sums arising from the  
Consolidated Revenue Fund to the Service of  
the Colony of *Tasmania* for the Years 1896  
and 1897. [23 December, 1897.]

BE it enacted by His Excellency the Governor of *Tasmania*, by and  
with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of  
Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows :—

1 Out of the Consolidated Revenue Fund of the Colony of *Tasmania* there shall and may be appropriated, issued, and applied, in the manner hereinafter provided, for the service of the Years 1896 and 1897, for the several purposes specified in the Schedule, any sum or sums of money not exceeding in amount respectively the several sums of money therein specified. Appropriation.

2 The Treasurer shall issue and pay the said several sums to such persons for the purposes hereinbefore mentioned, upon such days and in such proportions as the Governor, by any Warrant under his hand, Moneys payable

**3** The said Treasurer shall be allowed credit in his Accounts for any sums of money paid by him in pursuance of any such Warrant as afore-said ; and the receipts of the respective persons to whom the same are so paid shall be a full and valid discharge to the said Treasurer in passing his said Accounts for any such sums as are therein mentioned, and he shall receive credit for the same accordingly.
