AN ACT to amend " $A$ n Act to confer certain a.d. 1883. Powers upon the Municipal Council of the City of Hobart Town and Town of Launceston." [29 October, 1883.] B $_{\mathrm{E} \text { it enacted by }}$ His Exeelleng the Goveraro of $T$ asmanain, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows :-

1 All powers and authorities conferred upon the Municipal Council Power of fixing of the City of Hobart by the Eleventh Section of "An Act to confer rates to be paid certain Powers upon the Municipal Councils of the City of Hobart Town and Town of Launceston," shall extend and shall be deemed to have extended to the fixing rates and sums, no exceeding those named by Masters of vessels using in the Schedule, to be paid in respect of boats, barges, and vessels coming within the limits of any market or alongside any portion of a market which is or may be used as a wharf, by the masters or persons in charge of such boats, barges, and vessels who shall desire to make use of any part of such market or such wharf by unloading or discharging any goods on to such market or wharf, or on to any cart, dray, or vehicle thereon ; and until the same shall be varied or altered by the said Council, the rates and sums named in the Schedule shall be payable and be paid accordingly.
