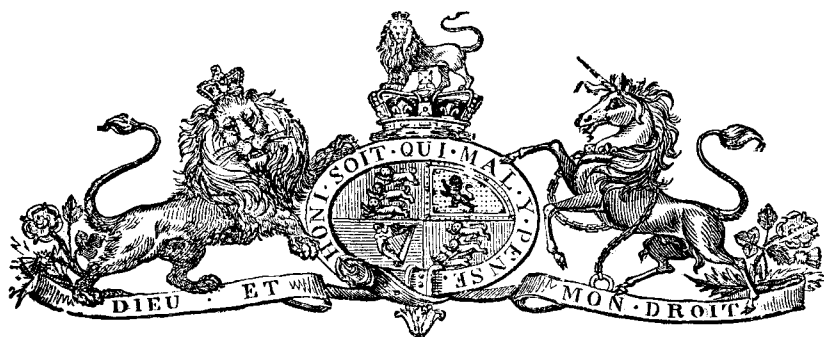

AN ACT to amend the Act 23 *Vict.* No. 13,
intituled *An Act to authorise the Franking
of certain Letters and Packets.*

[4 *October*, 1860.]

WHEREAS by the first Section of the above recited Act it is lawful for the Governor of this Colony, from time to time, to authorise Officers of the Government to frank official Letters and Packets, and it is ordained that such Letters and Packets so franked shall be exempt from Postage; and it is desirable that the Wardens of Rural Municipalities should be authorised to frank Letters and Packets which are on Police service: Be it therefore enacted by His Excellency the Governor of *Tasmania*, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows:—

PREAMBLE.

1 All Letters and Packets which are *bonâ fide* on Police service only, and are franked by the Warden of a Rural Municipality, shall be exempt from postage, provided that there is endorsed on any such Letter or Packet the words "On Police Service only," and that the signature of the Warden franking the same is subscribed to such words.
