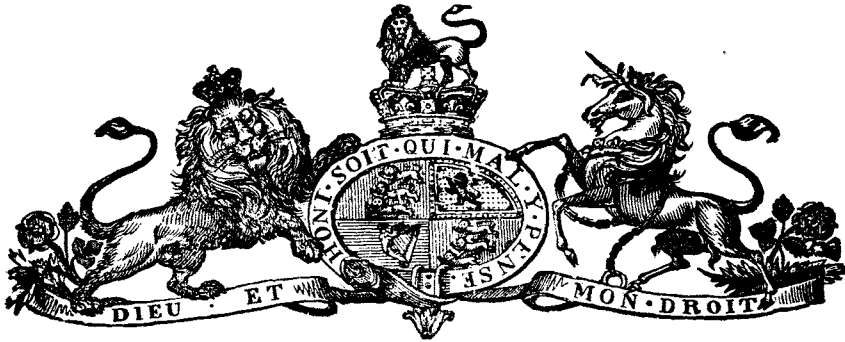

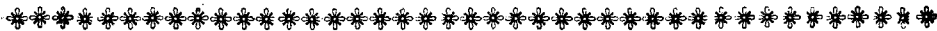

AN ACT to alter the Designation of certain Responsible Ministers of the Crown in *Tasmania*. A.D. 1882. [21 August, 1882.]

WHEREAS the Responsible Ministers of the Crown in many of the *British* Colonies fulfilling the like duties to those performed by the Colonial Secretary and Colonial Treasurer in *Tasmania*, are styled the Chief Secretary and Treasurer, respectively, of the Colony in which they are such Ministers : PREAMBLE.

And whereas it is desirable that the Responsible Ministers of the Crown in *Tasmania* called the Colonial Secretary and Colonial Treasurer of *Tasmania* should be styled the Chief Secretary and Treasurer of *Tasmania* respectively :

Be it therefore enacted by His Excellency the Governor of *Tasmania*, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows :—

1 The Responsible Minister of the Crown in *Tasmania* called “the Colonial Secretary” shall, after the commencement of this Act, be styled “the Chief Secretary,” and the Responsible Minister called “the Colonial Treasurer” shall, after the commencement of this Act, be styled “the Treasurer.”

Colonial Secretary to be styled “Chief Secretary,” and Colonial Treasurer to be styled “the Treasurer.”

2 Where in any Act of the Legislature of *Tasmania* the expression “the Colonial Secretary” is used, the same shall after the commencement of this Act mean the Chief Secretary ; and where in any such Act as aforesaid the expression “the Colonial Treasurer” is used, the same shall after the commencement hereof mean “the Treasurer,” anything contained in any Act to the contrary notwithstanding.

The expressions “Colonial Secretary” and “Colonial Treasurer” used in any Act to mean “Chief Secretary” and “Treasurer” respectively.
