

AN ACT to appropriate the proceeds of the A.D. 1892. Sale of certain Land for and towards the Construction of certain Buildings.

[21 December, 1892.]

WHEREAS the land described in the Schedule hereto was purchased for a Post and Telegraph Office site out of moneys voted by Parliament for "Post and Telegraph Offices generally," and is not now required for that purpose:

And whereas the Commissioner of Crown Lands is about to sell the said land as Crown Land, and it is desirable that the proceeds of the said land should be appropriated for and towards the construction of Post and Telegraph Offices:

Be it therefore enacted by His Excellency the Governor of Tasmania, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows:—

1 It shall be lawful for the Minister of Lands and Works, out of the Minister may conproceeds to be derived from the sale of the land described in the struct buildings Schedule hereto, to cause to be constructed or completed any building out of proceeds of or buildings to be used as a Post and Telegraph Office or a Post or or buildings to be used as a Post and Telegraph Office or a Post or Telegraph Office.

TOWN OF DEVONPORT.

All that piece of land in Section C. of the said Town containing thirty-nine perches and six tenths of a perch and bounded on the south by one hundred and twenty-three links and eight tenths of a link along Stewart-street easterly commencing at the south-eastern corner of Lot 4 purchased from the Crown by James Peters, on the east by two hundred links northerly along land occupied by G. E. Eastman, on the north by one hundred and twenty-four links westerly along Lot 7 purchased from the Crown by Francis Mary Hobkirk, and on the west by two hundred links southerly along Lot 4 aforesaid to the point of commencement.
