

AN ACT to authorise the Sale of Liquors at A.D. 1891. the Tasmanian Exhibition, Launceston, 1891. [19 October, 1891.]

BE it enacted by His Excellency the Governor of Tasmania, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows:-

1 Notwithstanding anything in "The Licensing Act, 1889," the Permits for sale Commissioners of the Tasmanian Exhibition, 1891, may, upon of liquor at such terms and subject to such conditions as a majority of the Exhibition, 1891. Executive Commissioners of the said Exhibition approve, sell, or issue Permits to sell, by retail, on the premises of the Exhibition, Launceston, any wines, spirits, ale, porter, cider, or other fermented or spirituous

Provided always, that the Permits issued by the Commissioners as aforesaid do not exceed in number Two, and that such Permits be issued only to a person or persons now holding a Public-house Licence in

2 The said Executive Commissioners in like manner may sell, or Colonial wine issue Permits to sell, by retail, Australian wines on the premises of the Permit may be Tasmanian Exhibition in Launceston.

Provided always, that the Permits issued by the Executive Commissioners do not exceed in number more than Four; and further, that such Permits may be issued to any person or persons without reference to the holding of a Public-house Licence.

3 The authority hereinbefore given to Commissioners to sell, and to Permits to be issue Permits to sell, liquors or Australian wines shall not have any only in force force or effect before the day of the opening of the Exhibition nor after the closing; and the hours of selling shall be from the opening of the Exhibition until the closing of the same each day, and shall be continued for the Six week days only.
