

AN ACT to entitle certain Persons to receive A.D. 1903.
Pensions upon their retirement from the Public Service of Tasmania.

[23 December, 1903.]

W HEREAS Bernard Shaw, now Police Magistrate at Hobart, PREAMBLE. was, in the year One thousand eight hundred and fifty-three, appointed to the Public Service of Tasmania:

And whereas he quitted the said Public Service in the year One thousand eight hundred and sixty, by reason of the office which he then held being abolished:

And whereas between the years One thousand eight hundred and sixty-six and One thousand eight hundred and sixty-nine he was temporarily employed by the Government of *Tasmania*, and in the last-named year he was again appointed to the Public Service of *Tasmania*:

And whereas it is desirable that a Pension should be paid to the said Bernard Shaw upon his retirement from the Public Service of Tasmania:

And whereas William Reynolds Cooke, now a Compositor in the Government Printing Office, was, on the Twentieth day of February, One thousand eight hundred and sixty-one, appointed to the Public Service of Tasmania:

And whereas his service therein has been continuous ever since, except for certain periods of time amounting in the aggregate to Forty-eight weeks, on which occasions his services were temporarily suspended owing to insufficiency of work in his Department:

And whereas it is desirable that he should be entitled to the benefit of *The Superannuation Act* upon his retirement from the said Service in the same manner as if his service had been continuous since the

year One thousand eight hundred and sixty-one:

And whereas John Hurford, formerly Office-Keeper at Government House, Hobart, was, on the Nineteenth day of March, One thousand eight hundred and fifty-nine, appointed to a position at Government House, and was, until the end of the year One thousand eight hundred and sixty-eight, paid out of the amounts annually voted by Parliament for His Excellency the Governor's Establishment:

And whereas from the end of the year One thousand eight hundred and sixty-eight until his retirement in the year One thousand nine hundred and two the said John Hurford occupied a position in the Public Service of Tasmania, and was paid directly by the Government of Tasmania, except during the tenure of office by His Excellency Frederick Aloysius Weld, Esquire, when the said John Hurford was paid out of the amounts annually voted by Parliament for His Excellency the Governor's Establishment:

And whereas it is desirable that he should be entitled to the benefit of *The Superannuation Act* upon his retirement from the said service in the same manner as if his service had been continuous since the

year One thousand eight hundred and fifty-nine:

Be it therefore enacted by His Excellency the Governor of *Tasmania*, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows:—

Annual pension of £150 payable to Mr. Bernard Shaw.

1 There shall be payable out of the Consolidated Revenue Fund to the said *Bernard Shaw*, upon his retirement from the Public Service of *Tasmania*, an annual Pension of One hundred and fifty Pounds during his life; and such Pension shall be paid monthly, commencing from the date of his retirement.

Treasurer to pay Pension upon Governor's Warrant. 2 The Governor shall, from time to time, issue his Warrant to the Treasurer for the payment of the said Pension, and the same shall thereupon be paid by the Treasurer to the said Bernard Shaw, or to such person as he from time to time, by writing under his hand, appoints to receive the same.

3 It shall be lawful for the Governor, by Warrant under his hand,

in case of the death of the said Bernard Shaw during the currency of

any month, to direct payment to be made to his personal representa-

tive of a proportionate part of such Pension up to the day of his death.

In case of death, payment of proportion of Pension to personal representative.

4 It shall be lawful for the Governor to grant a Superannuation Allowance, in accordance with and subject to the provisions of *The Superannuation Act*, to the said William Reynolds Cooke, upon his

retirement from his office in the Public Service of the State of Tas- A.D. 1903. mania, as if his service had been continuous from the said Twentieth day of February, One thousand eight hundred and sixty-one.

5 It shall be lawful for the Governor to grant a Superannuation John Hurford to Allowance, in accordance with and subject to the provisions of The have benefit of Superannuation Act, to the said John Hurford, upon his retirement from his office in the Public Service of the State of Tasmania, as if his service had been continuous from the said Nineteenth day of March, One thousand eight hundred and fifty-nine.

Such Allowance to take effect as from the passing of this Act.
