AN ACT to enable *Thomas Horne*, Esquire,
Puisne Judge of the Supreme Court of *Tasmania*,
to retire from Office on a Pension.

[4 October, 1860.]

BE it enacted by His Excellency the Governor of *Tasmania*, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows :—

1 In the event of the resignation by His Honor *Thomas Horne*, Esquire, now a Judge of the Supreme Court of *Tasmania*, of the said office of Judge on or before the First day of *November*, 1860, there shall be payable to the said *Thomas Horne*, Esquire, out of the General Revenue, an annual Pension of Eight hundred Pounds, during his life ; such Pension to commence from the day of such resignation, and to be payable and paid quarterly.

Pension of £800 payable to Mr. Horne on his retirement prior to 1st *November*, 1860.

2 The Governor shall, from time to time, issue his Warrant to the Colonial Treasurer for the payment of the said Pension, and the same shall thereupon be paid by the said Treasurer to the said *Thomas Horne*, or to such person as he, from time to time, by writing under his hand, appoints to receive the same.

Colonial Treasurer to pay Pension upon Warrant of the Governor.

3 In case of the death of the said *Thomas Horne* during the currency of any quarter of a year, it shall be lawful for the Governor, by Warrant under his hand, to direct payment to be made to his personal representative of a proportionate part of such Pension up to the day of his death.

In case of death, payment of proportionate part of Pension to personal representative.
