

# AN ACT to provide for the Execution of A.D. 1889. certain Public Works. [5 December, 1889.]

BE it enacted by His Excellency the Governor of Tasmania, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows:—

1 It shall be lawful for the Minister of Lands and Works to cause Minister to cause to be executed under the Acts therein respectively mentioned the several Works to be Works mentioned in the First Part of the Schedule, at a cost for each separate Work not exceeding the amounts set forth in the said Schedule respectively.

2 It shall be lawful for the Minister of Lands and Works to cause Minister to cause to be executed the several Works mentioned in the Second Part of the Works to be Schedule, at a cost for each separate Work not exceeding the amounts set forth in the said Schedule respectively.

3 The cost of the several Works specified in the Schedule shall be Defrayment of defrayed out of the moneys to be provided by Parliament for that cost of Works. purpose.

4 The sum of Two thousand Pounds appropriated by "An Act to Appropriation of provide for the Execution of certain Public Works," (52 Victoria, money voted by No. 67), for and towards the construction of a "Siding to Wharf, 52 Vict. No. 67. Launceston," shall and may be applied for and towards the construction of a new Coal Wharf at Launceston, including Railway sidings and necessary Works thereto.
