

ACT to provide for the Payment of a A.D. 1904. Pension to George Browne, Esquire. [24 May, 1904.]

WHEREAS George Browne, Clerk of the Supreme Court, PREAMBLE. Registrar of the Supreme Court in Bankruptcy, Judges' Associate, Registrar of the Supreme Court in its Local Courts Act Jurisdiction at Hobart, and Curator of Intestate Estates, has retired or is about to retire from the Public Service of the State of Tasmania:

And whereas doubts have arisen as to the amount of Pension or Superannuation Allowance to which the said George Browne is entitled on his retirement:

And whereas it is expedient to remove such doubts:

Be it therefore enacted by His Excellency the Governor of Tasmania, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows:-

1 There shall be payable out of the Consolidated Revenue Fund to Annual pension the said George Browne an annual Pension of Four hundred and fifty of £450 payable Pounds during his life; and such Pension shall be payable and paid to George monthly, commencing from his retirement from the Public Service of the State of Tasmania.

George Browne's Pension.

Pension to include any other Pension or Superannuation Allowance,

2 The annual Pension of Four hundred and fifty Pounds authorised to be paid by this Act shall be in lieu of and in substitution for any other Pension or Superannuation Allowance which the said George Browne shall be entitled to receive from the Government of the State of Tasmania, and any Pension or Superannuation Allowance heretofore granted by the Government of Tasmania to the said George Browne shall be deemed to merge and be included in the annual Pension authorised to be paid by this Act.

Treasurer to pay Pension on Governor's Warrant. 3 The Governor shall, from time to time, issue his Warrant to the Treasurer for the payment of the said Pension, and the same shall thereupon be paid by the said Treasurer to the said George Browne, or to such person as he from time to time, by writing under his hand, appoints to receive the same.

In case of death, payment of proportionate part of Pension to personal representative.

4 It shall be lawful for the Governor, by Warrant under his hand, in case of the death of the said *George Browne* during the currency of any month, to direct payment to be made to his personal representative of a proportionate part of such Pension up to the day of his death,
