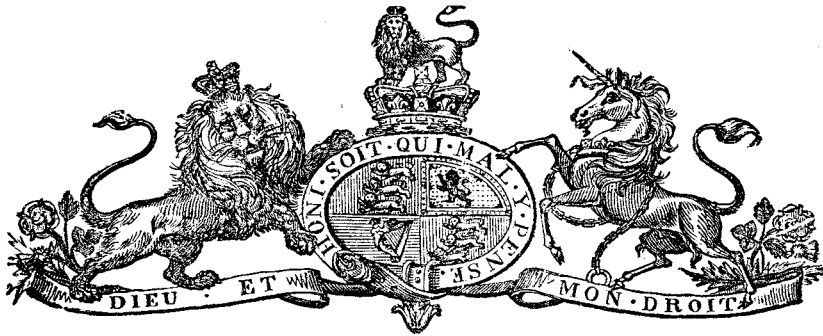

AN ACT to provide for the Remission of Penalties. [29 September, 1865.]

WHEREAS Penalties which under several Laws are made payable to parties other than Her Majesty cannot be remitted or pardoned by the Governor where no express provision has been made by Law for that purpose, and it is expedient that provision should be made for the Remission of such Penalties : Be it therefore enacted by His Excellency the Governor of *Tasmania*, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, that it shall be lawful for the Governor to remit in whole or in part any sum of money which under any Act now in force or hereafter to be passed may be imposed as a penalty or forfeiture on a convicted offender, although such money may be in whole or in part payable to some party other than Her Majesty, and to extend the Royal mercy to any person who may be imprisoned for nonpayment of any sum of money so imposed, although the same may be in whole or part payable to some party other than Her Majesty.

PREAMBLE.

Penalties for Offences may be remitted by the Governor although payable to parties other than Her Majesty.
