

AN ACT to prevent the Exportation of Warlike Stores. [4 October, 1860.]

BE it enacted by His Excellency the Governor of Tasmania, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows:—

1 The following goods may by Proclamation or Order of the Exportation of Governor in Council be prohibited either to be exported or carried Warlike Stores coastwise; that is to say,—Arms, Ammunition, and Gunpowder, may be prohibited.

Military and Naval Stores, and any articles which the Governor judges capable of being converted into or made useful in increasing the quantity of Military or Naval Stores; and if any goods so prohibited are exported from the Colony, or carried coastwise, or are water borne to be so exported or carried, they shall be forfeited.

2 This Act shall be deemed to have commenced and taken effect on Commencement the 30th day of *April*, 1860.
