By His Excellency SIR WILLIAM THOMAS DENISON, Knight, Lieutenant-Governor of the Island of Van Diemen's Land and its Dependencies, with the Advice and Consent of the Legislative Council.

AN ACT to repeal the Acts of Council of this Island intituled respectively An Act to prevent the Removal of Wine and Spirituous Liquors without a Permit and to make further Provisions to restrain the illicit dealing in and clandestine Importation of such Liquors and An Act to amend an Act passed in the Ninth Year of the Reign of His Majesty King George the Fourth intituled An Act to prevent the Removal of Wine and Spirituous Liquors without a Permit and to make further Provisions to restrain the illicit dealing in and clandestine Importation of such Liquors. VV HEREAS an Act of Council or Ordinance of this Island was PREAMBLE. passed in the ninth year of the reign of His late Majesty King George the Fourth intituled An Act to prevent the Removal of Wine and 9th Geo. 4, No. 4. Spirituous Liquors without a Permit and to make further Provisions to restrain the illicit dealing in and clandestine Importation of such Liquors whereby provision is made to prevent the removal of any Wine in any quantity equal to or above three Gallons or any Rum Cordials or other Spirituous Liquors in any quantity equal to or above one Gallon without having first obtained a Permit for such removal or conveyance of the same under certain penalties therein mentioned and whereby other provisions are made to restrain the illicit dealing in and the clandestine Importation of such Liquors—AND WHEREAS another Act of Council or Ordinance of this Island was passed in the second year of the reign of Her present Majesty Queen VICTORIA intituled An Act to amend an Act passed in the Ninth Year of the Reign 2 Vict. No. 6. of His Majesty King George the Fourth intituled An Act to prevent 16 Vict. No. 16.

the Removal of Wine and Spirituous Liquors without a Permit and to make further Provisions to restrain the illicit dealing in and clandestine Importation of such Liquors—AND WHEREAS it has been found that the said recited Acts of Council are entirely unproductive as a source of Revenue are wholly inoperative as a protection to the Revenue and are useless unnecessary and objectionable and it is therefore expedient that the said recited Acts should be repealed—BE IT THERE-FORE ENACTED by His Excellency SIR WILLIAM THOMAS DENISON Knight Lieutenant-Governor of the Island of Van Diemen's Land and its Dependencies with the advice of the Legislative Council thereof that from and after the passing of this Act the said recited Act intituled An Act to prevent the Removal of Wine and Spirituous Liquors without a Permit and to make further Provisions to restrain the illicit dealing in and clandestine Importation of such Liquors and also the said recited Act intituled An Act to amend an Act passed in the Ninth Year of the Reign of His Majesty King George the Fourth intituled An Act to prevent the Removal of Wine and Spirituous Liquors without a Permit and to make further Provisions to restrain the illicit dealing in and clandestine Importation of such Liquors shall be and the same are hereby repealed excepting always as to offences committed and matters or things done before the passing of this Act which shall be dealt with respectively as if this present Act had not been passed.
