AN ACT to amend the *Building Act 1937*.  
 [19 October, 1943.]

BE it enacted by His Excellency the Governor of Tasmania, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows:—

**1** This Act may be cited as the *Building Act 1943*.

Short title.

**2** The Principal Act is hereby amended by expunging subsection (3) of section fifty thereof and substituting therefor the following new subsection (3)—

“(3) The Council may refuse to approve of the plans of any building proposed to be erected which, in the opinion of the Council, by reason of the architectural design or elevation, or the size, quality, or nature of such building would—

- I. Injurious affect the value of property: or
- II. Be out of conformity with a standard designed to be maintained or established by the Council for buildings erected in any section of a city or town—

in the vicinity of the site of the proposed building.”.
