

(2) The net profit made in this business by the Commission in any financial year shall be paid into the Consolidated Revenue.

5—(1) Subject to the provisions of this Act, the Commission may requisition the Treasurer for any sums required by it for the purpose of this Act.

(2) Subject to subsection (4) of this section, the Treasurer may pay any sum so requisitioned to the Commission forthwith, and may borrow money for this purpose.

(3) The Commission may repay to the Treasurer any amount not at the time so required by it.

(4) The Treasurer shall not make any payment to the Commission under this section whereby the total indebtedness of the Commission to him hereunder would exceed one hundred thousand pounds.

(5) The Commission shall on account of the Consolidated Revenue pay interest on the amount for the time being held by it quarterly on the last days of September, December, March, and June respectively in each financial year at the State rate as defined by section twenty-four of the *Hydro-Electric Commission Act 1944**.

6—(1) The Commission shall furnish to the Minister annually a report of its business under this Act in respect of the immediately preceding financial year together with a copy of its accounts under section four for that financial year as certified by the Auditor-General.

(2) The Minister shall lay before each House of Parliament, within the first ten sitting days of the House after his receipt of them, each annual report under this section, together with the accompanying accounts.

BANK HOLIDAYS.

No. 81 of 1951.

AN ACT to amend the *Bank Holidays Act 1945*.
[18 December, 1951.]

BE it enacted by His Excellency the Governor of Tasmania, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly in Parliament assembled, as follows:—

1—(1) This Act may be cited as the *Bank Holidays Act*

(2) The *Bank Holidays Act* 1945*, as subsequently amended, is in this Act referred to as the Principal Act.

Banks in Hobart and Glenorchy to be closed on Saturday.

2 Section two of the Principal Act is amended by inserting at the end thereof the following subsections:—

“(2) Every bank and branch of a bank carrying on business elsewhere than in the city of Hobart or the municipality of Glenorchy may be closed throughout the whole of every Saturday and shall have the same rights and immunities under section seven of the *Bank Holidays Act* 1919† as if every Saturday were a bank holiday thereunder.

(3) At least twenty-four hours before closing in accordance with subsection (2) of this section the bank or branch of the bank shall, unless it was so closed on the previous Saturday, give public notice of such closing in at least two issues of a newspaper.”

BEACONSFIELD, BEAUTY POINT, AND EXETER SEPTIC TANKS.

No. 82 of 1951.

AN ACT to make provision for the Installation and Maintenance of Septic Tanks in the Towns of Beaconsfield, Beauty Point, and Exeter.

[18 December, 1951.]

BE it enacted by His Excellency the Governor of Tasmania, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows:—

Short title and construction.

1—(1) This Act may be cited as the *Beaconsfield, Beauty Point and Exeter Septic Tanks Act* 1951.

(2) This Act shall be read and construed subject to the *Public Health Act* 1935*.
