## AN ACT to amend the Criminal Injuries Compensation Act 1976.

### [Royal Assent 29 September 1988]

**B**<sup>E</sup> it enacted by His Excellency the Governor of Tasmania, by and with the advice and consent of the Legislative Council and House of Assembly, in Parliament assembled, as follows:—

- 1—This Act may be cited as the Criminal Injuries Short title. Compensation Amendment Act 1988.
- 2—This Act shall commence on the day on which it receives commencement. the Royal assent.
- 3—In this Act, the Criminal Injuries Compensation Act Principal Act. 1976\* is referred to as the Principal Act.

Amendment of section 5 of Principal Act (Jurisdiction of Master to make

- 4—Section 5 of the Principal Act is amended by inserting the following subsection after subsection (3):—
  - (3A) The Master shall not make an award to a person if that person has failed to do any act or thing which, in the opinion of the Master, that person should reasonably have done to assist in the identification, apprehension, or prosecution of any person alleged to have committed the criminal conduct or alleged criminal conduct for which compensation is claimed.
